Like a great panorama there passed before me millions of black Americans, both dead and living, who had toiled in mines, farms, ditches, factories, cook-kitchens and elsewhere, to make America a "decent place in which to live." "Ins Japanese, whose country a few days ago blew up and sank an American ship, which took the lives of several American citizens and wounded many more, had more rights, more freedom in my own country than I. a native born American Negro. I shall hever lorget the incident. I can not forget it."

JAPAN, CHINA AND THE NEGRO PEOPLE

(By Cyril Briggs, Editor Crusseer Nows Agency) One-fifth of the human race live in China. White militarists in many ages have dreaded the prospect of the consolidation of the 450,000,000 Chinese people into a united nation. Of this prospect, Napoleon warned Europe:

"There lies a sleeping giant." Let him sleep! For when he wakes. he will move the world.'

This fear of a united and powerful China is shared today by all the imperialist powers. The despoilers of Africa and Asia are well aware of the deadly menace to imperialism inherent in the struggle of the Chinese people for national emancipation.

It would be impossible to overestimate the importance of Cnina in world politics and in relation to the future of all mankind. It is no exaggeration to say that the emergence of the Chinese ple as a free and powerful nation would rock world imperialism, fready badly shaken by the defection of Russia from the imperialist camp.

It is this consideration that makes the present conflict in the Far East of vital concern for us, and for all other victims of imperialist oppression. This consideration holds good whether one approaches the question with an understanding of the necessity, for us and for all humanity, of the destruction of the imperialist system, or with the Nationalist desire for the creation of formidable non-white military power as a counter-balance to the armaments of the "white powers.

For us the important tactical consideration is that the rise of a free and powerful China inevitably must effect a tremendous change in the relation of forces-in our favor. The Chinese people can attain their national emancipation goal only by a military victory over one of the imperialist powers, or a combination of perialists. In either case a Chinese triumph would weaken, if not deal a death blow, to the imperialist system.

That in the circumstances of the present war, such a victory must be gained over a non-white invader does not detract from its
