ERICKS, N. C., (Special)-The North Carolina Association of New Farmers of America will hold their Annual Summer Camp at Bricks School in Edgecomb County, Aug. 3rd, 4, & 5 according to announcement given out by S. B. Simmons State Adviser for this organization.

There will be about 150 Negro farm boys and teachers Vocational Agriculture attentiing the 3-day camp. The major purpose to be accomplished at the camp will be to train these students in how to conduct appropriate recreation for rural communities. Much stress will be placed on community singing and various games. The winners in the state wide N. F. A. Farm Practice Program and the State N. F. A. Chapter Contest will be announced at the camp. The winning students and chapters president in each of the four districts in the state will be given a trip to the National N. F. A. Convention which will convene in Savannah, Georgia, August 21. Second place winners will receive cash prizes. These contests are sponsored by the State Department of Public Instruction, in cooperation with the Chilean Nitrate Educational
