The unorthodox subject per mitted the speaker boundless la titude, and it was interesting to trace the style Dr. Apspacher employed in delivering an essay which might well have been titled, T'h e Achievement of

Assuming that success a n happiness are synonymous the speaker inferred that the lifemust be the happy life, and that by achieving happiness, one invaribly achieves success.

"However, Dr. Anspacher con tinued, "Happiness does not come natuality it must be earned. But doing this never aim fo hap niness. Consider it as a by-pro-

His deliberations on work were practical. "Since work tan he defined as doing anything that we don't like to do, there is no virture in work as work." All ahcievement is dependant upon it, yet one must not En wrap himself up in his work to the extent that he excludes the finer things from his life.

Gold nuggets of thought flow ed freely from the speaker's lips as he enlightened the candidates on "Intelligent Neglect." What cant be cured," said Dr. meher, Queht to be enjoyed. The ability to do without things is the first step in t h e achievement of happiness."

Continuing the speaker said "Fear is the enemy of all loy. We therefore must face our fears and then overcome them. Warning the candidates again at following "ambitions unrelat-

ed to capacities;" Dr. Anspacher concluded his address by say ing, "The greatest happiness comes in doing things, being things, and not so much in hav-

No Action Yet On Virgin Island Relief Bill

gin islands revenue troubles, introduced two months ago, has not been considered, and no consideration for it is yet scheduled, according to information received from the House Ways and Means committee as June arrives.

In the meantime, the Negro farmers and merchants of the islands, denied the advantages of their sister possesion, Porto Rico and the Philippiness, face the prospect of a new fiscal year without the small deficiency appropriation needed to carry on the simplest functions of government.

Since 1867, the United States government has wanted the Danish West Indies, now the Virgin islands, for a first line defense against aggression that might threaten from across the Atlantic. Not since the early days of their colonization have any of the countries who have temporarily held them looked upon these islands as a source for revenue. To the European countries as to the United States, these islands have meant the control of the
