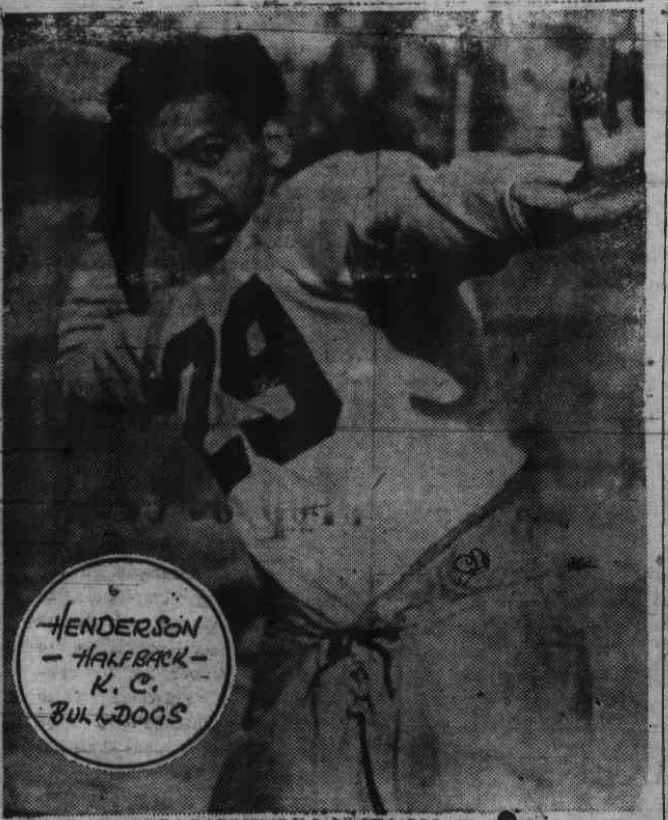
Nullifying the flashing of brilliant running shown by Elliott and Van Buren both of whom were in almost every play.

Team Captain is William "Cutler" Gould who hails from Portsmouth, Virginia and has been repeatedly mentioned for all CIAA honors this year.

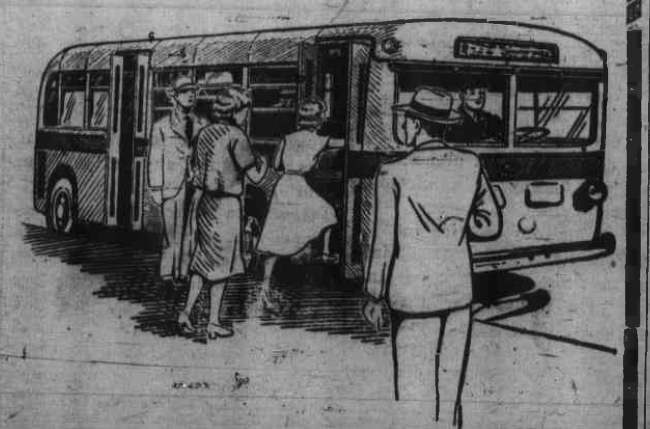
Table with columns for Year, Morgan, and Lincoln, showing scores from 1923 to 1938.
