Place over rapidly belling water and cook 10 to 12 minutes after water boils again, stirring frequently. Beat egg white until just stiff enough to hold shape. Fold hot taploca mixture gradually rold not taploca mixture gradually-into egg white. Cool — mixture thickens as it cools. When slightly cool, add flavoring and ginger, re-serving 2 tablespoons ginger for garnish. Chill. Fold in cream. Serve in sherbet glasses. Garnian with additional whipped cream, and sprinkle with ginger and nuts.
