

Morris Brown Tops Wilberforce In Thrilling Steel Bowl Game

Birmingham, Ala. — Morris Brown College football team won the inaugural steel bowl game here Wednesday, 19-3, over the Wilberforce University team before 10,000 fans.

The Atlantans scored twice on long runs and after covering up a Wilberforce fumble, picked up another touchdown.

Bill Schnebly of Wilberforce scored a field goal early in the game, but the Ohio team even then failed to threaten Morris Brown.

Morris Brown rumbled through to its first touchdown shortly after Schnebly's field goal, and John Moody cracked the line for a series of first downs. From Wilberforce's 33, Joe Jenkins, 163 pound lightning back, swept right end on a double reverse to a touchdown.

In the third period, Pershing Norris fumbled Cecil Franklin's punt over the Wilberforce 13 and Moody went over in one smashing plunge.

Hovering in scoring territory much of the time, the Atlanta team dominated play throughout the contest. Haywood Settles and William Wysinger, tackles Stan and Gerald Brown, end figured in stopping the attack. Outstanding defensively were Troy Ross, Shelton Bell and Charles Lofton.

Jenkins struck with a lightning thrust in the fourth when he took Schnebly's strategic punt and the classic is planned each year as an annual New Year's Day clash between the nations' leading Negro football teams. As a result of Wednesday's victory, Morris Brown holds the national title.

Burke Defeats Stanton 19-0 In Seacoast Bowl

Charleston, S. C. — The Burke High Fighting Bull dogs defeated the strong heavy Station High Blue Devils from Jackson Fla. by a score of 19-0 in the second annual "Seacoast Bowl."

Running from behind an unbalanced line the Bulldogs received the ball and after two plays kicked out to Stanton who likewise tried three plays and kicked.

Both teams kicked frequently in the first quarter but midway the second quarter the bulldogs open their bags of tricks and moved from Stanton's three yard line. At this point a new quarter back was sent into the game to use the famous "Goal Line Special," a play starting as a line buck, but ends up in a fake forward pass. The play was made from Dippy Middleton to Cash the first half ended Burke 6 Stanton 0.

As the whistle started the second half Stanton's heavy Blue Devils started a drive down the field but was soon stopped by the hard charging Bulldogs. Stanton kicked out and three plays moved down to Stanton's 30 yard line. A substitution was made and a forward pass intended for Burke's big left end, Middleton, was battered into the air by a Stanton player the ball falling to the arm of Bob Simmons, who was following up the play. Simmons crossed the Goal line untouched. The extra point was missed again.

The first score was made in the last quarter after an exchange of punts Burke took the ball on their 45 yd line and on the next two plays Burke was thrown for losses Middleton kicked out and "Wild Man" Ladson recovered the punt on the five yd. line after the ball touched a Stanton player.

A United Program For Education Aim Of P.-T. A.

A Group of educational leaders from all sections of North Carolina representing the Parent-Teacher Association, the Association of School Boards, the North Carolina Education Association and the State Grange recently met in Raleigh and in cooperation with Clyde A. Erwin, State Supt. of Public Instruction, agreed upon a legislative program to be submitted to their organization in the State. The program suggested is as follows:

political dismissal from service, such amendments to be of a character that will afford adequate protection for the teachers without involving the State in undesirable complications that have been experienced in some of the states and of such nature as will guarantee the school and community against incompetent and undesirable teachers.

3. Salaries. Realizing that the salaries of teachers and other school employees are out of line with the income of other groups, we request the most liberal increase possible in the teaching salary schedule, beginning with a ninth increment for teachers, a fifth increment for principals, sick leave for school employees, and financial recognition for superior teaching. We urge a State school budget approximately \$30,000,000 a year.

4. Enrichment of school program.

a) Vocational Education. We urge substantial increase in North Carolina appropriations for vocational education to match Federal funds for this purpose.

b) Local initiative and responsibility for schools. We urge that the right of voting supplements for schools be extended to all legally constituted school districts without discrimination. We recommend that school machinery provisions be amended to grant local board of commissioners and aldermen, on advice of school boards, the right to levy taxes for all such items as are constitutionally permissible for the improvement of schools above the State minimum standards of safety and health in bus transportation be made mandatory in all school units of the State.

c) Expansion. If any expansion of State wide educational facilities is possible under present conditions, we recommend that the next step be a twelfth year rather than a ninth month. Both are desirable when the State's tax resources permit.

d) Compulsory Attendance. We recommend the raising of the age limit for compulsory school attendance from 14 to 16 years, with a definite placement of responsibility for enforcement.

5. Constitutional Amendment. In order to avoid the duplication and overlapping of authority now existing in the administration of the public school system of North Carolina on the part of the several agencies charged with such administration, we favor submitting to the voters of the State a constitutional amendment creating a representative and adequate State Board of Education, in which board will be vested all the State's authority, power and responsibility for administration of the State School System.
