## Riddick Issues Call To Hillside Hornets

### Daily Drills To Begin At Hillside Park August 27

Durham — Coach Herman Riddick of the Hillside Park High School Hornets is scheduled to arrive in Durham August 24 and will waste no time in beginning to put his charges through their paces for the coming season. Drills twice daily will get under way Wednesday, August 27, at Hillside Park. In a special message to the CAROLINA TIMES, Coach Riddick who has been studying at the University of Michigan this summer, stated that he realizes that it is going to be no easy task to get a comparatively new team in shape for a game in three weeks but he and all his staff will give all that they can to the effort. The first game is slated for September 18 against Darlies High School of Wilson in Dur-

ham. **MANY TO BE REPLACED.** Uppermost in the minds of the Hillside Coaching staff are thoughts of possible replacements for regulars who graduated last June or will not return for other reasons. On the line there will be vacancies left by Perry, Lawrence, Pike, Brewer, Southern, Land, Pugh, Graves, while the backfield will sorely feel the absence of Co-Captain Blount, Thompson, and Plummer. Other men whose names were not available will be missing this fall. The Hillside schedule has not been completed yet although it is likely that it will be the toughest card in several seasons. Attempts have been made to give the Hornets three national ratings that

they have so long deserved by playing the leading schools in other states if such can be arranged. As usual Coach Riddick will be ably assisted this year by Coach W. H. Cole, Jr. who has been in Durham all summer working with one of the city playgrounds.
