



Q. M. C. Salvage Unserviceable Army **Goods Worth Millions**

Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 24 .- As a result of the reclamation work of the Quartermaster Corps, million of dollars worth of unserviceable Arny material has been turned back into usable property and less than salvage in the eight southeastern states during the past two years, Lieutenant Colonel William F. Riter, supply officer of the Fourth Corps Area Quartermaster office, announced today.

"In 1940, \$1,529,285.78 was adthorized for repair, alteration and renovation of clothing and equi page; in 1941 the funds for this work amounted to more than six million dollars. Much of the reclamation was done by the Quartermaster Corps and the remainder was sent to private concerns. The QMC maintains clothing shows, wood shops, shoe shops and various other outfits," Col. Riter explained, adding that the funds spent saved many times that amount on new equipment.
