RATIONING MILEAGE

EXCESS TIRES MUST BE SOLD BY NOV. 22ND

Various autoists must dispose of any tires they own in excess of the permissible five per car before Nov. 22 in order to retain their right to hold mileage rations it was announced Monday.

"We urgently request that these excess tires be turned over to the government at once," it was stated. "But in any event owners must get rid of them by November 22. Any vehicle operator without tire inspection record on that date will be in violation of the mileage regulations."

It is unlawful for any person to have in his possession more than five passenger automobile tires after Dec. 1, 1942.

Booklets Tells Of Soldiers' Dependents And Welfare

Atlanta, Ga. — A booklet giving information concerning provisions made under the law covering Army regulations and instructions for the welfare, protection and security of soldiers' dependents, is announced by the War Department to the south-eastern states today through headquarters, Fourth Service Command.

The booklet, entitled "Personal Affairs of Military Personnel and Their Dependents," will be distributed in the Army so that every soldier will have access to it, including those already in the service and others as they enter. Dependents and others desiring copies of the booklet may obtain them by writing to the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C. and enclosing 10 cents to cover the cost of printing.

Information carried in the booklet includes allotment of pay and deductions; pay, allowances and allotments of personnel reported missing, missing in action or captured; joint bank accounts; medical attendance and hospital facilities for dependents and covers countless other points about the welfare of the soldier and those he left behind.
