

LATIN AMERICAN LEADER BLASTS RACE DISCRIMINATION IN TALK BEFORE TEXAS CHURCH GROUP

MEXICO CITY — Vicente Lombardo Toledano, Latin American labor leader, last week urged an audience in the Temple Baptist church at El Paso to throw unconditionally everything they have into the war effort to "defeat fascism" and to "forge a happier world in which race discrimination will no longer exist."

"Fascism is based on race discrimination and that is its most savage, sanguinary, primitive and brutal aspect," declared Toledano, who is president of the Confederation of Latin-American Workers. "To insure the progress of the world, the racial problem must disappear."

The labor leader spoke at the invitation of the Rev. William Nicholsberry and the board of trustees. Many local leaders, soldiers, and dignitaries filled the church to capacity with Negroes and whites mingling freely.

Among the prominent persons present were Sr. Antonio Bermudez, mayor of Ciudad Juarez and Gen. Barrigueta, commander of the Mexican garrison. Mrs. Toledano surrounded by little children was given a place of honor with other distinguished guests.

"Brothers this is the first

time I have spoken in a church," continued Toledano. "he expect that the world of tomorrow will be a democratic world with all the liberties of that system. But for that it is necessary that all peoples fight, and above all those who have suffered most."

"If that happens, then we shall be able to say that there exists Christian democracy. No more slaves, no more ignorance and no more persecuted people. We hope that it will be thus."

4 N. C. Boy Grads At U. S. Navy Station

Some of the graduates were advanced to petty officer ratings at time of graduation, while the others were graduated as seamen and will have an opportunity to obtain

their ratings soon after reporting to their new assignments.
