**JOHNSON AND ROSS NAMED TO FEPC SECRETARIAL POST**

Washington, July 31, (ANP)—Organizational structure of the Fair Employment Practice committee has been just about agreed upon, it is learned reliably, and as matters now stand, George M. Johnson, formerly assistant secretary to the old committee, will share the secondary level of authority with Malcolm Ross.

For a little while there had been some uncertainty as to how Johnson's position would stack up in the reorganized committee. At the press conference following the initial meeting of the new committee, Fr. Fabian J. Haas, chairman, referred to Haas and Ross as his "assistants." Actual titles have not yet been agreed upon, so it is reported, but respective authority has.

It appears that there will be three operational divisions and

one administrative. The latter will tie in directly to the chairman, whereas the other three will clear through the assistants.

Ross will exercise authority over the review and analysis division, and Johnson will keep an eye open on the hearings division. Field operations will be a matter of joint responsibility with Ross handling external affairs such as group and public contacts, while Johnson will concern himself with the internal functioning, primarily the business of the regional offices and cooperation with other agencies.

Will Maslow, formerly with the National Labor Relations board, has been put actively in charge of field operations, and it is probably Harry Baron will do the leg work in review and analysis. No decision appears to have been made yet with regard to a counterpart for hearings.

Ted Jones, administrative officer, will continue in that capacity, and will continue to handle personnel and budgetary matters.
