## **General Counsel For CIO** Wants Anti-Poll Tax Bill **Reported Without Delay**

sel of the CIO. (Congress of Industrial Organizations) today told the Senate Judiciary Committee, hearing arguments on the constitutionality of HR 7, the bill to abolish the poll tax in Federal elections, that:

"All we ask is that the elected representatives of the people be given a chance to pass on this issue which the Senate, in three and a half years, has never had."

Mr Pressman pointed out that the House of Rrepresenta tives has twice passed antipoll tax legislation by overwhelming votes, and urged that the Senate Judiciary Committee report the measure without further delays to the floor of the Senate for a vote. Mr. Press man said that if an irresponsible minority of Senators attempted a filibuster to prevent the Senate from voting on the bill, it would be "a travesty of the democratic process."


