(Continued from Page One) health insurance plan. Dr. Marshall told the members of the society, meeting for the 63rd time, that he could not think of any reason that physicians should object to the government's providing the means for making people capable of paying for their medical care.

Dr. Marshall further stated that there is a difference between what the national health insurance plan opponents have been saying is "socialized medicine" and the Truman health plan. He said that too many physicians have been misguided on this point by the "professional propagandists". It was also pointed out here this week that the AMA South of the Mason-Dixon line has never accepted Negroes into its ranks, and that until the national health insurance plan came along, the northern AMA had refused to put Negroes on important, policy-forming groups.

Dr. Murray, a native of New

Orleans, is 62 years old. He was graduated from Howard University's school of Medicine in 1914. He served as assistant surgeon-chief at Freedman's Hospital, Washington, D. C., from 1919-1920.

Presently director of the gynecology department at the Harlem hospital and of obstetrics and gynecology at Sydenham hospital of New York, he is a trustee of Howard University; member of the executive committee of the Medical Society of the County of New York; a diplomate of the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology; a fellow of AMA, New York Academy of Medicine, American College of Surgeons and International College of surgeons.

(Continued from Page One) Carolina Trustee Board, in addition to asserting that the school facilities provided Negro students at the grammar and high school level are substantially equal to those provided for whites, denied that it furnished

transportation to white students and not to Negro students. The Board also requested the court to dismiss the complaint on the grounds that the complainants had not exhausted administrative remedies by appealing to the State Board of Education after the County Board had refused to end discrimination against the Negro students.
