## Dr. L. T. Wright Gets Posthumous Award For His Cancer Research

**NEW YORK**  
The late Dr. Louis T. Wright was awarded the 1952 American Cancer Society medal posthumously, for his research in cancer which he conducted for 33 years at Harlem Hospital before his death in October, 1952. He is the first Negro to be given the medal.

Mrs. Louis T. Wright, widow of the physician, accepted the award at a luncheon held at the Hotel Astor Sunday afternoon to launch the 1953 Cancer Crusade. Also participating in the ceremonies were the two daughters of the late physician: Dr. Jane C. Wright and Dr. Barbara Penn Wright, both engaged in cancer research.

The medal, awarded for "most outstanding contribution to cancer control," was presented to Mrs. Wright by Dr. John C. A. Gerster, one of the founders of the New York City Cancer Committee, who was lavish in his praise of the late Harlem physician.

In presenting the award Dr. Gerster said that the New York City Cancer Committee this year unanimously voted the award to "our greatly beloved, late member, Dr. Louis T. Wright."

In citing some of the activities of the cancer specialist, Dr. Gerster pointed out that "among numerous distinctions, he had been chairman of the board of directors of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, chairman of the medical board and director of the Cancer Research Foundation of Harlem Hospital; and from 1948 to his death had been a member of the New York Surgical Society."

April has been designated Cancer Control Month by a Presidential Proclamation and by an Act of Congress. The New York City Cancer Committee has accepted a quota of \$1,401,000

to be raised during the month, as its share of the American Cancer Society's national goal of \$18,000,000. Funds raised will be allocated to local and national research projects, professional and public education, and services for cancer patients.
