Lawyers Guild May Get On Subversive List

WASHINGTON, D.C. Whether the controversial Lawyers Guild, which is headed by prominent Negro attorney Earl Dickerson, will go on the list of subversive organizations, may be decided shortly by court action.

The Guild was notified originally by Attorney General Brownell that he proposed to designate it as subversive. Immediately the Guild asked the

U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia to issue a preliminary injunction, temporarily barring the Attorney-General. It also charged Brownell had branded the interracial group of lawyers as Communist-dominated, thereby prejudging the case.

The District Court rejected the injunction plea and later the U. S. Court of Appeals directed that the case should be given a full airing in the lower court. As it stands now, Federal Judge Charles McLaughlin has under consideration a motion to declare that Brownell may proceed with steps to place the Lawyers Guild on the list of subversive organizations.
