phical school districts are not established; or 2) keeping present school assignments but permitting students voluntarily to apply for re-assignment without racial distinctions.

For new students, however, only the first method would conform to the Constitution, the AVC brief declares, since in the absence of a voluntary application by a student, race or color would continue to determine his assignment. This effect, would entrench segregated school systems.

The brief points to many areas of daily life to show that "the fears that desegregation will cause widespread violence are largely wraiths and myths" and declares that experience shows that rapid desegregation is often smoother and easier than segmentalized desegregation.

Attorney for the AVC in the school cases, on which the Supreme Court will hear rearguments on December 6, is Phineas Indritz.

ate end to an existing unlawful practice, but whatever measures the Court may decide upon to implement the decisions, a time limit should be specified, the attorneys for the Negro children and parents argue.

The May 17th decision was the result of five cases brought before the high court challenging the validity of the statutes requiring the separation of the races in public and elementary schools. They came from Kansas, South Carolina, Delaware, Virginia and the District of Columbia.
