 (Makes one 9x9x1 1/2 inch pan)

1 cup sugar
 2 tablespoons butter
 1 egg
 1 teaspoon vanilla
 2 squares (2 ounces) melted unsweetened chocolate

1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
 1 teaspoon double-acting type baking powder
 1/2 cup undiluted CARNATION EVAPORATED MILK
 1 cup chopped nuts

Blend sugar, butter, egg, and vanilla, until light and fluffy. Add melted chocolate. Mix well. Mix flour and baking powder together. Add to sugar mixture alternately with Carnation. Stir in nuts and
