

SIX-POINT CIVIL RIGHTS PLANK BEING SENT TO DEMOCRATIC AND REPUBLICAN MEETS

Both Parties Will be Asked to Enforce Desegregation Order and Curb Senate Filibuster

NEW YORK
Proposals for a six-point plank on civil rights, subscribed to by 30 national organizations affiliated with the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights, have been sent to all delegates to both the Democratic and Republican national conventions, Roy Wilkins, chairman of the conference and executive secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, announced here today.

Subscribing to the proposed civil rights platform plank are the following organizations: Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity; Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen of North America; American Civil Liberties Union; American Council on Human Rights; American Jewish Congress; American Veterans Committee; Americans for Democratic Action; Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters; Catholic Labor Alliance; Congress of Racial Equality; Friends Committee on National Legislation; General Department of United Church Women, National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.; Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the World; International Union of Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers; Jewish Labor Committee; National Alliance of Postal Employees; National Association for the Advancement of Colored People; National Association of Colored Women's Clubs; National Community Relations Advisory Council; National Council of Negro Women; National Supreme Council Scottish Rite Masons; Union of American Hebrew Congregations; Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America; United Automobile Workers of America; United Hatters, Cap and Millinery Workers; United Steelworkers of America; United Synagogue of America; United Transport Service Employees of America; Women's International League for Peace and Freedom; and Workers Defense League.

North Carolina College Professor Off To Rorschach Confab In Rome

Dr. Carol C. Bowie, professor of psychology at North Carolina College, is scheduled to leave the United States on August 9 to attend the Rorschach International Conference for Psychoanalysts in Rome, Italy, September 15-18.

The NCC professor is scheduled to leave New York aboard the Christopher Columbus of the Italian lines. She will return to the United States by air after the Rorschach meeting.

Dr. Bowie will vacation briefly in Wil, Sicily. She will be the guest there of Dr. and Mrs. Kenower Bash. Dr. Bash is a lecturer at the June Institute of Psychoanalysts.

Before returning to the U. S. Dr. Bowie will visit Capt. and Mrs. B. N. Smith who are stationed with the U. S. Army in Bamberg, Germany. The Smiths formerly lived in Salisbury.

Dr. Bowie is a graduate of Oberlin College and she holds the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Chicago.

Prior to joining the NCC faculty in 1949, she taught psy-

chology at Bennett, Knoxville and Barber Scotia colleges.

She was employed as a psychologist for three years in the Normal, Illinois, branch of the Institute for Juvenile Research.

She was formerly a psychologist for a diagnostic court clinic in Chicago and for two years she was a clinical psychologist with the Veterans Administration in Tuskegee, Ala.
