

Retiring NCC Faculty Members Presented With Gifts And Mementoes In Congratulatory Social Program

Four members of NCC's faculty and one member of the college's staff, all retiring at the end of the current academic year, were honored last week-end with a congratulatory social program immediately following the year's last faculty-staff meeting held in the auditorium of the Education Building.

Special mementoes and gifts were presented to the retiring personnel by members of the college's faculty and staff.

The five retiring personnel and the years they started work at NCC are: Mrs. C. Ruth Edwards, music, 1931; Charles L. Holmes, Spanish, 1930; Mrs. Nell Hunter, music librarian, 1952; Wesley I. Howard, music and director of the band, 1945; and William Petty, maintenance employe, 1948.

Mrs. Edwards, professor of voice, formerly served as chairman of the music department. Prior to joining NCC's staff in 1931, she was head of the music department at Kittrell College. She holds degrees from NCC and Columbia University. Mrs. Edwards has also studied voice and piano extensively with noted teachers in several U. S. cities.

Howard, a native of Richmond, Ind., received his training at the New England Conservatory of Music, Trinity College, London, L'Ecole Normale,

Paris, and Columbia University. He was a band master during World War I in France. Since

then he has taught and conducted bands at Howard University, Talladega College, Virginia State College and Hampton In-

stitute.

Holmes is a native of Pueblo, Colorado. He received the A.B. degree at Colorado College and the M.A. at the University of Michigan, where he did predoctoral work.

Mrs. Hunter is a native of Memphis, Tenn. She has taught at NCC on two previous occasions prior to her present tenure. She had extensive experience as choral director with the Federal Music Project in the 1930s. She also served with the National Youth Administration.
