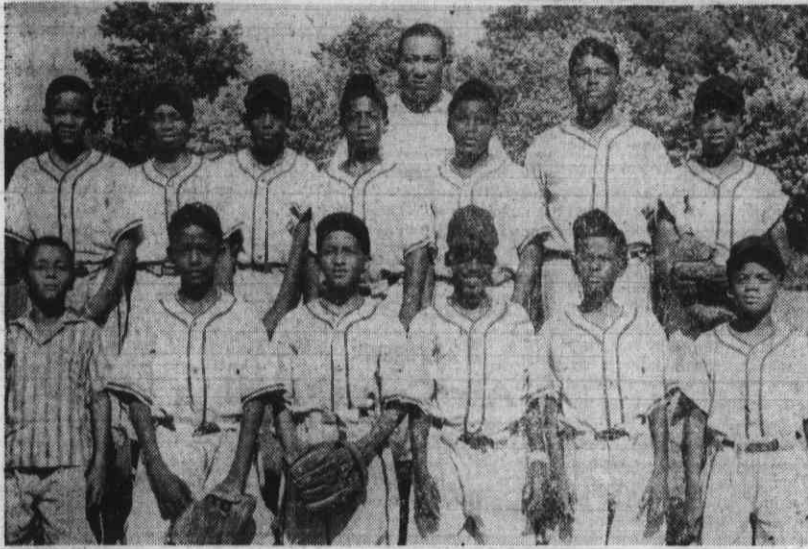


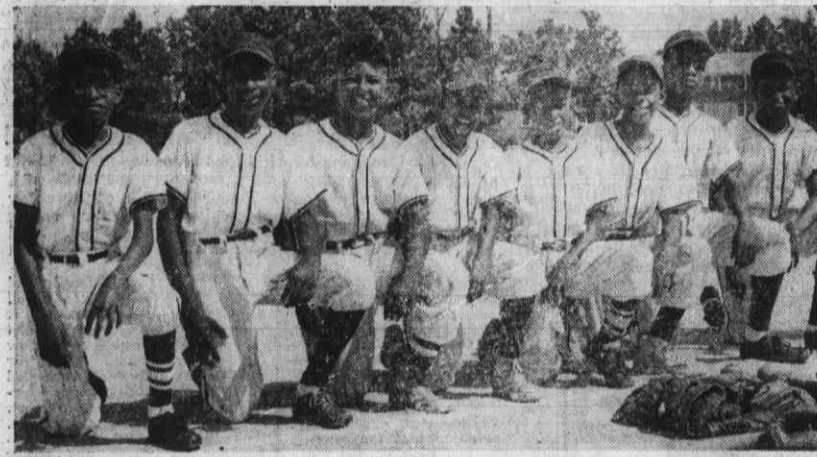

## Jefferson, Tutor Of Teams Once Scourge Of CIAA, To Be Honored In Chicago For Over 35 Years In Sports

(CIAA News Service) The National Athletic Steering Committee will honor Harry R. "Big Jeff" Jefferson for thirty five years "contribution to the development of youth through athletic coaching and administration" at the Washington Park YMCA in Chicago on August 15. Jefferson, who is presently associated with Berca College in Philadelphia, ended his active coaching career at Hampton Institute in 1956.

The popular mentor's life time football record is 181-86-18.

Jefferson's career began at Kelly Miller High School, Clarksburg, West Virginia, in 1922.

He was at Wilberforce University in 1923 before returning to Kelly Miller in 1924.

His five year association with Bluefield State College began in 1925. His first term at Bluefield ended in 1929. Jefferson's 1927 and 1928 teams at Bluefield were league champions. From 1930 to 1931 Jefferson coached at North Carolina A&T in Greensboro. He returned to Bluefield for the 1922-1933 season.

At Virginia State College where he moved in 1934, Jefferson remained until 1948, producing CIAA championship teams in 1936, 1938, 1939, and 1945.

Jefferson was associated with Harpton Institute from 1949 to 1958.

In addition to active coaching Jefferson served as vice president of the CIAA's Central district, one of the founding members of the highly successful CIAA Basketball Tournament Committee, and as Chairman of the influential Committee on Committees.

He is now an honorary president of the CIAA.

From 1955-1956 Jefferson served as a member of the Rules Committee of the American Football Coaches Association. Since 1957 he has been a mem-

ber of the AFCA's Fatal Injuries Committee.

Jefferson served as chairman of the NASC during 1956-57.

J. B. McLendon, Jr., Executive Secretary of the NASC, is in charge of arrangements for the Jefferson Awards Day program in Chicago.

## Babe Ruth Tops Selections For All-Time Team

NEW YORK

Babe Ruth heads an all-time American League all-star team selected by 120 members of the Baseball Writers Association of America for SPORT MAGAZINE. According to the current issue, out last week, July 29, there was close voting for most positions with the final selections as follows:

first base - Lou Gehrig  
second base - Eddie Collins  
third base - Jimmy Collins  
shortstop - Joe Cronin  
left field - Ty Cobb  
center field - Joe Di Maggio  
right field - Babe Ruth  
catcher - Bill Dickey  
righthanded pitcher - Lefty Grove

SPORT stated that the closest contest was for the center field slot, with Joe Di Maggio edging the traditional choice, Tris Speaker, by a scant one vote. Bill Dickey took catching honors by a 59-50 margin over Mickey Cochrane, while Lou Gehrig finished 25 votes ahead of George Sisler.

Highest vote-getter, said SPORT, was Babe Ruth with a near-unanimous 107. He was followed by Lefty Grove, 105 and Ty Cobb, 104. Possibly the most unfamiliar

name in the line-up, stated the magazine, is that of third baseman, Jimmy Collins, who outdistanced Frank "Home Run" Baker by more than 15 votes.
