Greensboro Site Of Jehovah's Witnesses Annual Meet; Bible Held Chief Weapon In Fight With Reds

Jehovah's Witnesses of circuit 26 have chosen Greensboro as the place for their semiannual circuit assembly for 1959, it was announced. Local witnesses plan to attend.

The announcement was discussed at the local Kingdom Hall. Dur-

ing the discussion, O. M. Stokes, presiding minister, told the congregation that development of Christian thinking through accurate Bible knowledge and understanding is the greatest bulwark against godless communism and other forms of atheism so prevalent in the world today.

This Greensboro assembly is to last three days, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, April 17-19. It is sponsored by the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society of Brooklyn, New York.

The program is especially designed to give Jehovah's Witnesses and their friends three days of advanced Bible knowledge and ministerial training, Stokes said. About 600 delegates from 21 congregations are expected to attend. All sessions will be open to the public.
