C., 1936-38; Friendship Baptist Church, Winston Salem, N.C. 1938-47; Rising Star Baptist Church, Walnut Cove, N. C., 1941-47; Friendship Baptist Church, New York City 1947-59; Executive Secretary, General Baptist Convention of North Carolina 1945-47.

His Religious activities include Delegate, World Council of Churches, Evanston, Illinois 1954; Lecturer, Benedict-Morris Colleges Minister's Conference, in summers of 1956-7-8; National Director, Prayer Pilgrimage for Freedom 1957; Delegate to New York Churches to World Convention on Christian Education, Tokyo, Japan in the summer of 1958.
