Strong WSTC Team Ties for 1st in Marine Relays

QUANTICO, Va. — A band of three clads from Winston-Salem Teachers College scored a triple in the two-day track and field extravaganza at Quantico's Butler Stadium, and racked up enough points to emerge from the meet, sharing top honors with Penn State's Nittany Lions.

The win established the Rams as the team to watch in the upcoming CIAA track and field meet to be staged this year at Virginia State College on May 2.

Four stalwarts carried the Ram colors to fame, including their world famed hurdler Elias Gilbert, who ran a leg in each of the races. Bob Manning, Charley Lewis, and Frank Bowns were the Rams writing their names in gold in the mud of the Quantico track Saturday.

Wilbur Ross' Rams captured the 440 and 880 sprint relays, the 480 yard shuttle hurdle relays, and Joe Middleton took first in the

hop, step and jump, to lead all CIAA schools at the meet. North Carolina College, Morgan State and Howard University were the other schools from the CIAA participating in the meet.

In the sprint relays, the Rams, led by Elias Gilbert, world record holder in the 220 yard low hurdles, running without one of its strongest legs with Vance Robinson left at home with an injured foot, won the class A mile relay with a time of 3:21.5 on the heels of taking the sprint medley relay against some of the nation's finest on Friday.

He was picked as the winner by two judges, while two others picked him as the second place finisher. The head judge, however, declared Basil Ince of Tufts as the winner. Both runners were clocked in identical times of 48.3.

North Carolina College's tennis players won their match here last week when they put away Hampton Institute, 8 to 2. The Eagles, the conference's defending visitation and tournament champions, now have a loop record of 2 wins against no losses. Their only regular season defeat came at the hands of powerful Cornell, in an inter-sectional affair.

The win over the Pirates put the Eagles' netters out front in the race for the CIAA visitation crown. The Pirates, rated as NCC's stiffest opposition, fell easily under the potent depth of Jimmy Younge's racketmen.

In the top-seeded match, Hampton's James Stroud and NCC's Zack Davis fought it out in a three set duel, with Stroud coming from behind to win the last two dueling sets and the match.

Davis won the first set, 6-4, but succumbed to the Stroud, the CIAA's defending singles champ, in the last two sets, 0-6, 5-7.

In the second match, NCC's No. 2 netter, lanky Maurice Handy, upset last year's tournament finalist in the singles, Eugene Donan, in straight sets, 6-4, 6-3.

Handy, playing his usually consistent and brilliant game, handled the bigger and more powerful Donan with ease as he won his second straight loop match, remaining as the unbeaten singles netter on NCC's squad, in CIAA competition.

In the doubles, NCC's No. 1 two-some of Davis and Handy pulled the upset on Hampton's favored duo of Stroud and Donan, and toppled them, 6-0, 6-2.

In the second doubles match of the afternoon, Alan Townsend and Carlton Bell, NCC, defeated the Pirates' William Merritt and George Davis, 6-2, 6-4.
