

Problem of Providing Good Housing for All Economic And Racial Groups Subject of Howard Univ. Talks

WASHINGTON, D. C. — The problems involved in providing adequate housing for all economic and racial groups will be discussed at Howard University during the annual three-day spring conference of the Division of Social Sciences, which begins Wednesday, April 22nd.

The theme of the conference will be "Adequate Housing for all Americans." Sessions are scheduled for 8 p.m. Wednesday, 2:30 and 8 p.m. Thursday, and 8 p.m. Friday. All sessions will be held at Andrew Rankin Chapel, Sixth St. and Howard Place, northwest, and will be open to the public.

Among the featured speakers during the parley will be representatives of government, private enterprise, economic organizations and groups designed to promote better racial understanding. Faculty participants at Howard include Dr. G. Franklin Edwards, associate of sociology and chairman of the Division of Social Science, Dr. Emmett E. Dorsey, associate professor of government; H. Naylor Fitzhugh, assistant professor of business administration; and Dr. Harry J. Walker, associate professor of sociology.

Wednesday's meeting will be devoted to a discussion of the nation's housing needs. The principal speaker will be Morton Hoffman, who heads a consulting service in urban studies and economic analyses. Hoffman also serves as consultant in area development for

The role of government in providing adequate housing will be discussed during Thursday's afternoon session. Speakers include George B. Nesbitt, intergroup relations officer for the Urban Renewal Administration of the Housing and Home Finance Agency, and Philip Sadler, special assistant to the commissioner of the Public Housing Administration.

The role of private enterprise in meeting the housing need will be discussed Thursday evening. Speakers include Guy Hollyday, chairman of the board of the Title Guaranty Co. of Baltimore and executive committee members of the American Committee to Improve Our Neighborhoods (ACTION), and Ernest T. Eiland, president of the Washington Real Estate Brokers Association.

Dr. Frank Horne, chairman of the New York Commission on Inter-Group Relations, will be the principal speaker at Friday's meeting. From 1938 to 1953 Dr. Horne held positions with such governmental agencies as the U. S. Housing Authority, Office of Defense Housing and Housing and Home Finance Agency.

change was included in the School Consolidation Proposal which was defeated by an overwhelming vote of the people. Our Council membership was against the proposal at that time, and since then has strengthened its belief and affirmation of the present system.

We are interested in good public schools directed by dedicated citizens who will devote their time and energies to the welfare of our children and schools, and not politicians who will be interested in the votes from the people. We further believe that the members of our City Council are in a better position to evaluate, appraise, and select the type of members qualified for the school board than any other existing group.

It is, therefore, our hope that you will refrain from introducing any bill contrary to the above opinions to the General Assembly.

We observed from the newspaper releases that you asked the City PTA Council if it wanted a change in the way the City School Board members are being selected. We have read and studied the replies of that organization and the reaction of other interested citizens.

The Durham PTA Council unanimously agreed and went on record as opposing a change in the present appointive method of selecting members to the City School Board of Education. The proposed

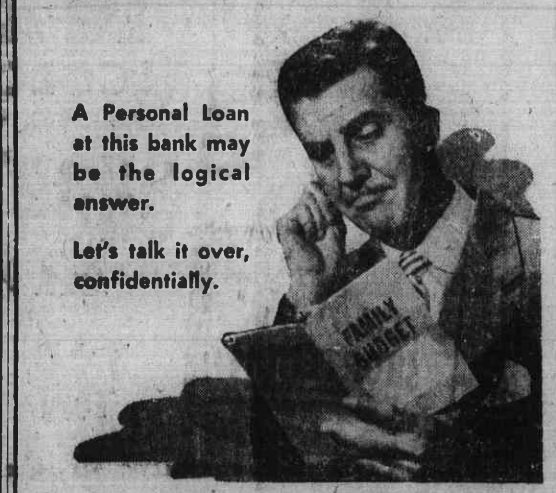
