ROPER — The Washington County Union Beavers, playing their first football game under the direction of new head coach H. T. Pettiford, licked the losing jinx that has been plaguing them all season by defeating the C. S. Brown High eleven 16-14.

The Beavers kick off to the visitors and forced them to punt after three downs. Then the team work that has been stressed so much in the Beaver practice sessions this week paid off as the blue and gold team put on a drive from their own thirty-five yard stripe which culminated with fullback Freddie Spruill driving over for the first counter of the game. Then Spruill bulled his way over for the extra points making the score 8-0.

The visitors took advantage of a series of miscues that cost the Beavers penalties and tallied on a sustained drive to knot the count at 8 all as the half ended.

During the third period, the visitors again took the initiative and foraged ahead of the home-standing Beavers 14-8 until the 4th and final quarter when the Beavers caught fire again and roared over for its second touchdown of the contest adding the winning extra points on a pass from quarterback Glenn Johnson to halfback James White.

Coach Pettiford's statement after the game referred to the fine defensive play of the whole team as the Brown eleven knocked at the door repeatedly throughout the contest. "I think our fellows played tremendously when it seemed that a sure touchdown was in the making everytime that big fullback of theirs got the ball. We have been stressing two things in practice this week, fundamentals and teamwork and it seems they paid off. It was a fine team victory both offensively and defensively."

Rattlers Strike Down S. C. State Gridmen, 34-12, In Rain, Before Cheering Homecoming Crowd

BRAGG STADIUM, Tallahassee — Boggled down on a rain soaked field, Florida A&M got by a rearguarding South Carolina State bunch of gridlers 24-12 here last Saturday afternoon.

A nearly capacity Homecoming crowd, which included the Honorable Governor LeRoy Collins filed into the 11,000 seat stadium to watch the popular Rattlers keep their '59 slate clean and head for the road next week.

The Rattlers got off to their usual early start in the first period with what seemed to have been a 75-yard sustained drive. Fullback Jordan Pope fumbled on the Bulldogs' three. Bulldog tackle

Al Ferguson jumped on the ball to turn fortune into fate.

Not being counted out, A&M rolled back with star-studded halfback Clarence Childs of Lakeland, Fla. bulling his way down to the South Carolina 26 on a punt return. Sophomore halfback William Wilson of Tallahassee and A&M's leading ground gainer went the 26 yards on the next play to score. Sophomore Emory Collier, who operates the sweat unit, tallied the points after on the keep.

Awed by the much publicized power of the bulldozing Rattlers and their highly touted offensive machine, South Carolina State stood its ground and held the nation's top small college eleven in rushing offense to a single TD in the first stanza. FAMU got two in the second quarter and led 20-0 at the halftime intermission.

The next two A&M pointers came in the second period. Tackle Frank Merchant blocked Center Carroll Thompson's punt, followed it eight yards, and retrieved it. The ball was blocked on the South Carolina State 42 and was stilled on the 31 by Merchant. Two plays later fullback Lorenzo McFadden went through the State line for the TD on a quick handoff from quarterback Ben Lampkin. Lampkin was hit hard attempting the

Collier came back on the scene in the final first half play for A&M and was the star actor. He pitched 41 yards to end Jim Miller for a touchdown and ran the extra points.

Displaying a totally defensive game most of the first half, the Bulldogs turned the tables on the surprised Rattlers and racked up a couple of six-pointers themselves in the third quarter. Quarterback Melvin Galloway tripped the first Bulldog TD with a sneak out to Winfred Kennedy. The senior fullback from Orlando, Fla., passed 45 yards to sticky lineman end Jim Payton of Memphis Tenn. who reached 30 more yards into the end zone. Galloway missed to end Robert Beasley on the PAT try.

NEW YORK — The 32nd annual Holiday Seals campaign of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People was announced here recently by Roy Wilkins executive secretary.

The NAACP Holiday Seals campaign is a creation of Mrs. Memphis T. Garrison, Huntington, W. Va., school teacher. Mrs. Garrison ran the first four campaigns from her home. When the workload became too heavy, the Association's national office took over in 1931.

Mrs. Garrison is still an active NAACP worker. She conducted full-time NAACP membership drives this year in Cincinnati and in Charleston and Huntington, W. Va.

The first Christmas seal drive in 1927 raised a total of 291.38. Last year the campaign brought in a net of \$65,408.97.

Miss Bobbie Branche of the Association's national office staff is serving as director of sales for the eighth consecutive year.
