College-Trained Negro Woman Must Lend Herself to Community Activities, Delta National President Declares at Durham Luncheon

Dr. James L. Noble, of New York, made her initial bow to Durham as national president of the Delta Sigma Theta sorority in a series of entertainments given her by the Durham chapter of the sorority.

In a formal luncheon regaled in a decor of yellow fall flowers with red streamers, the New York University professor delineated the role Negro college women must play in the modern world.

"The college woman of neces-

sity must be so educated as to become an integral part of community living; and this means not only a broader horizon of occupational choices but a re-orientation of values as one prepares for life's work," she declared.

She held that the fraternal woman must not only be "B" average in the sorority, but "B" average in community participation.

In view of the shrinking world by communications, the accelerated pace of living because of auto-

mation, and the explosion of the population bomb within the next decade, college women must seek new ways of keeping up with the rapid changes and adopting fraternal techniques to match the new day, she continued.

Adding tremendous status to the dignity of her presentation, the audience was prepared for this through the knowledge of her scholarly writings. As an author, she has called America's attention to the Aspirations of Negro Col-

lege Women: The Negro Woman's College Education.

Dr. Noble, a native of Albany, Georgia, is currently Assistant Professor, Center for Human Relations Studies at New York University. She received her undergraduate training at Howard University, Master of Arts and Doctor of Education degrees at Teachers College, Columbia University. She has studied further at University of Birmingham, England.

She has taught at Albany State College, Georgia; Langston University, Oklahoma; Tuskegee Institute, University of Vermont and New York City College. Guidance counseling, Developmental Psychology, and areas of Personnel Counseling are the areas of specialization to which she has lent her research ability. Aside from her present major book, she is collaborating with Dr. Margaret Fisher on the textbook: "College Education As Personnel Development."
