He is expected to feel free to discuss political issues in the Durham rally.

Daly was one of the attorneys for the plaintiffs in the case. Besides Yancey, other Tarheel communities with integrated schools are Charlotte, Winston-Salem, Greensboro, Durham, Goldsboro, Havelock, Chapel Hill and Raleigh.

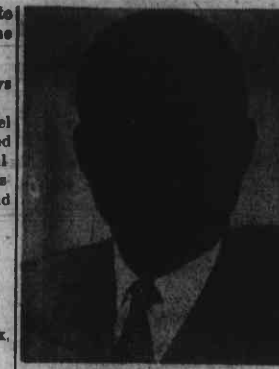
