Miss Louise Latham is director of Region No. 3 and presided over the business sessions. Mrs. V. Bessele Atwell, Executive Director of the National Council of Negro Women, Inc., with headquarters in Washington, D. C., was Conference Leader. Region Number three is comprised of N. C., South Carolina, Tennessee, Ga., and Florida. There were forty-five Council members in attendance. The theme of the Conference was "Higher Horizons For Unity of Purposes and Unity of Action," and the Conference focus was "The Local Council at Work."

The conference opened Saturday morning with the President's Roundtable, "This Is Our Best," following registration. Each president gave a summary of the best activity that had happened in their Council during the past year.

During a break, we were led in a "Sing Along" by Miss Thelma Denson and Mrs. Atwell at piano. Mrs. Ellen Alston of Raleigh led a most impressive meditation following the "Sing Along."

The morning Conference comprised the following: presentations, adoption of rules/report of 1960 regional conference by Mrs. Emma Randolph and the following committees were appointed: Resolutions, Time and Place, Reporters, Nomination during the mid morning session.

Mrs. A. Bessele Atwell, Executive Director NCNW spoke on "A National Organization at Work" and "The Council Idea." Every council member there felt that she had caught something from the workshops that she could carry back and use effectively. The workshops were Structure, Membership, Program and Finance.
