BALTIMORE, Md.—Negro Methodists played prominent roles in the first National Convocation on Christian Concerns of The Methodist Church, held at Mt. Vernon Place Methodist Church here recently.

Serving as discussion leaders or recorders were the following: Miss Theresa Hover of the Woman's Division of the Board of Missions, New York; the Rev. Ernest T. Dixon of the Board of Education, Nashville; the Rev. Dr. Clarence T. Nelson, district superintendent of the Lexington Conference, Columbus, Ohio; the Rev. Earl H. Crampton, Philadelphia pastor, and the Rev. Dr. J. Inman Dixon, Cincinnati, Ohio. Bishop Matthew W. Clair, Jr., head of the St. Louis Area of the denomination, was a member of the Message Committee. The Rev. Dr. Daniel Ridout of Baltimore directed the 100-voice interracial choir at the mass meeting in Constitution Hall, and the Rev. John Bryan, professor at Bennett College, Greensboro, was worship leader. Joe Rogers, 78-year-old lay leader of St. James, Chicago; Miss Rhoda Jordan, Hollywood actress; Charlyne Hunter, University of Georgia co-ed; and the Rev. Jerry Walker, pastor of the integrated St. James Church, Chicago, were members of a panel at one of the evening sessions. The convocation drew 800 delegates from every State in the Union. They came to grips with the social problems of the day, but failed to adopt the statement to the church framed by the Message Committee.
