pany have home office in Durham. John H. Wheeler of Durham, the bank's sixth president, has been with the firm since 1929. He succeeded the late Dr. C. C. Spaulding who headed the bank and insurance company until his death in 1952.

The bank's progress is one of the bright spots in the activities of Negro Americans. Capital funds of the bank have grown from \$10,000 when operations began on August 1, 1908 to more than \$780,000 last June.

Mechanics and Farmers' total resources today are more than \$10,000,000 million. The Durham firm is the second largest of the Negro operated banks in the United States.

An experienced staff, headed by I. O. Funderburg, cashier, will begin Charlotte operations on March 1. Accompanying Funderburg from the Durham home office will be the bank's

assistant cashier Nathaniel H. Lipscomb, Sr., Miss Deloris B. Witherspoon, and Mrs. Mildred S. Harvey.

The two young women received special training in the Durham home office during the past year. Walter S. Tucker of the Raleigh office will also become a member of the Charlotte staff.

Funderburg, a veteran of World War I, is the first Negro to graduate from Rutgers University's Graduate School of Banking. He is a native of Monticello, Ga., and received a B. A. degree from Morehouse College before doing advanced work in business at the University of Michigan. He's been with Mechanics and Farmers since 1948. He became cashier in 1952.

Tucker is also a World War II veteran. A native of Baltimore, Md. he graduated with a B. S. degree in business from Virginia State College. He joined the bank's home office staff in 1958 and was transferred to the Raleigh branch in 1959.

Lipscomb has been with the bank since 1954. He was one of the first Negro salesmen on Main St., in Durham.

Spears is a native of Cabarrus County. An active Presbyterian layman, he served twice as moderator of the Catawba

Presbytery, four terms as chairman of the Pensions Fund Committee, and was elected three times as Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A.

Now a retired district manager of N. C. Mutual, Spears serves as treasurer of the Mecklenburg-Charlotte Council on Human Relations. He previously served three terms on the Executive Committee of the National Council of Presbyterian Men.

During the first weeks of operation the Charlotte office will also be under the experienced supervision of the bank's senior personnel, Wheeler, the president, and two of the bank's Raleigh executives, senior vice president James E. Strickland, and James J. Sansom, vice president and manager of the Raleigh office.

Other North Carolina cities listed maintain the same number of patrolmen in 1961 as were listed in the 1954 survey.

The report also showed that seven of 20 North Carolina towns surveyed do not allow Negro officers to arrest white offenders. Included in these towns are Asheville, Carrboro, Chapel Hill, Charlotte, Guilford Co., Morganton, and Rocky Mount.

### HILLSIDE GETS NEW BAND UNIFORMS

Hillside high school received its new band uniforms this week and will give the public its first look at them in a concert next Thursday.

Some 82 brand-new, shiny suits were delivered to the school this week for the band. Seventy-two of the uniforms are for bandmen, eight for majorettes, and one of the new uniforms is for the director.

The uniforms were purchased to replace the old ones which had been used by the school since 1948.

The purchase was made after a year-long drive conducted in the community. Approximately \$5,000 was raised during the drive.

The concert next Thursday night, to be staged at the high school auditorium at eight o'clock, is billed as an "Appreciation Concert."

Hillside principal Harold M. Holmes explained that it is the school's way of showing its appreciation for the contributions made by Durhamites to the drive for funds for the new uniforms.
