Vanderbilt Conference to Explore Ethics of Integration Dec. 27-29

ATLANTA, Ga. — Several hundred Southerners concerned with race relations will have "a consultation" on "The South: Ethical Demands of Integration" December 27-29, at Vanderbilt University Law School in Nashville.

The Fellowship of Southern Churchmen and the Southern Regional Council are sponsors of the conference, where Martin Luther King, Jr., Atlanta, head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, James McBride Dabbs, president of the Southern Regional Council and other leading Southerners will speak and conduct discussions.

"Desegregation is only the first step on the road toward the good society," says a statement explaining the theme of the meetings. "Segregation removes the legal and physical barriers to the enjoyment and exercise

of the rights and responsibilities of our common life. The process of desegregation, too slow in speed and too small in amount, must go on. Integration is the next step the positive acceptance of desegregation and the glad welcoming and full participation of Negroes into the total range of human activities."

Dr. King will speak on "An

Analysis of the Ethical Demands and Morehouse College professor. The conference will hear reports on three studies of changes in southern cities. "The Public Schools in Charlottesville, Va.," from Thomas Hammond and Paul Gaston of the history department of the University of Virginia; "Equal Employment in Greensboro, N. C." from Sarah Herbin and Tarti Bell of the American Friends Service Committee; and "The Role of Religion in Desegregation Efforts in Atlanta," from Dr. Samuel Williams, pastor of Friendship Baptist Church in Atlanta, president of the Atlanta NAACP.

Dabbs will make the closing talk of the conference, which begins the afternoon of December 27, and ends at noon December 29.

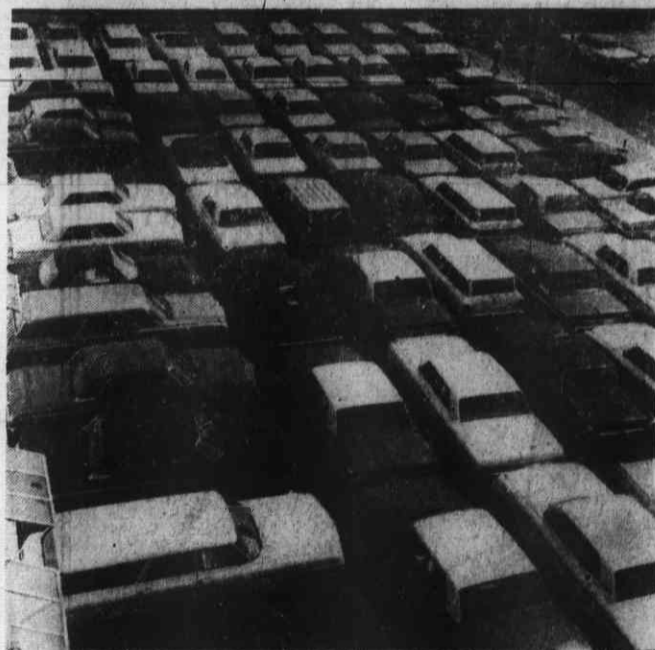
