

## Western All-Stars Take Advantage of Eastern Team's Miscues to Record 20-0 Shrine Victory

An alert Western All-Star prep club took advantage of several East miscues to rack up a 20-0 victory in the sixth annual Shrine Youth Bowl game here Saturday, December 8. The game was played before a slim crowd at Durham County Stadium.

The East, coached by David A. Kinson, Rocky Mount, and W. D. Peerman, Chapel Hill, had seven fumbles and the West, coached by David Lash, Winston-Salem and James Davis, Hickory, recovered four of them. On two occasions, the victors turn the miscues into scores.

It was a sweet victory for the Westerners. In the previous contests, the East had won three while the West won two. The win evened the series at three wins apiece.

In the opening minutes of the contest, Robert Johnson, Lexington, pounced on an East fumble on the 20 yard line. Quarterback Charles Nevels, Winston-Salem, carried to the six yard line on the third play and Hildred Hill, also of Winston-Salem, scored on the next play. The try for the extra point failed.

Another East fumble this time recovered by Robert Sullivan, Lexington, on the 47 of the losers, set up the West's second TD. Nevels completed 32 yard pass to Clarence Adams, Gastonia, on the East's 15. Leonard Clay, Hickory, carried for two yards and on the next play Hill ran to the one. He carried for the touchdown on the next play. Nevels ran the two-point conversion, and the West had a 14-0 margin, which they maintained the rest of the half.

Halfback Bill Allsbrook, Monroe, electrified the crowd with a nifty 70-yard punt return in the opening minutes of the third quarter. The try for the conversion failed.

The East crew had only one scoring threat and that was in the first half. They drove from their 32 yard line, only to lose the ball on a fumble on the 23 of the West.
