The responsibility of such an agency is of grave importance that go a long way toward eliminating many of only the nighest celiher of officials, employees the shortcomings that may exist, at the inand service should be tolerated. For that 'stitution. very reason we are of the opinion there inspector or inspectors is in order to guarantee that the same yardstick of grading all hospitals, eating places, hotels and other institutions is used.

There are entirely too many unanswered questions in the solution to the situation created by the recent fire at East End Elementary School. While the parents of the pupils attending the school, and interested citizens of the community and city, are perfectly willing to put up with certain disadvantages that cannot be avoided on account of the fire they will not be satisfied with see ing a substandard replacement of the destroy ed structure. Add to this the already overcrowded condition that existed at the school and its lack of sufficient ground area and the question naturally arises as to what is the wisest course to pursue in the matter?

We think the Durham City Board of Education would take a wise step if it invites the Durham Committee on Negro Affairs to assist it in working out a satisfactory solution to the problem. After all the schools belong to the people and at least when an emergency one of them they should be heard.
