### The Old Treatment for Psoriasis Still Found to be Very Effective

A modified form of a psoriasis remedy widely used in Europe a half century ago has proven superior to a steroid hormone remedy in a comparison study reported in the current issue of Dermatology Digest. The new-old remedy is anthralin (Anthryl Cream); the steroid, fluocinolone acetonide.

Author of the report is Sidney Olansky, M. D., professor of medicine at Emory University in Atlanta, Ga. In it he surveys recent medical articles on treatment of the stubborn and mysterious affliction, psoriasis, including those on steroid therapy, as well as a 1935 report on anthralin, a synthesis of carbon, hydrogen, and oxygen which has been used successfully in Europe as far back as the First World War.

Suspecting that no modern remedy provided benefits equal to those obtained with anthralin, Dr. Olansky set up a study using Anthryl Cream. This remedy com-

### Training For Rural Youths Initiated in N. J.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Secretary of Labor W. Willard Wirtz and Governor Richard J. Hughes of New Jersey signed a manpower Development and training Act contract that initiated a \$420,000 project to help 603 rural youths prepare for training and jobs.

Many of the young men and women who will be enrolled in the program are Puerto Rican and Negro youth between the ages of 16 and 21 who moved into the State with their migrant farm worker families and have chosen to remain. They are, for the most part, uneducated, unskilled and living in poverty.

### John A. Holley Joins Shaw U. Publicity Staff

RALEIGH—John Anderson Holley, formerly assistant to the Executive Secretary of the Virginia Teachers Association, Assistant Editor of the V.T.A. Bulletin, and Director of Publications and Publicity since August 1962, has joined the staff at Shaw University as Director of Publicity and Publications. Holley assumed his new duties February 1.

The project will be directed by John C. Bullitt, who heads the New Jersey Office of Economic Opportunity.

In announcing his approval of the program, Secretary Wirtz stated: "The program I am approving will soon become a triple-threat attack against the privation that would otherwise prohibit these young men and women from improving their circumstance in life."

"Employment at a decent wage is only the immediate goal. To enable these young people to win a measure of confidence and self-respect, to give them a stake in a worthwhile society, is the achievement we hope someday to have earned."

### NATL ALUMNI COUNCIL TO MEET IN N. Y. FEB. 5-7

NEW YORK — The National Alumni Council of the United Negro College Fund will hold its 19th annual conference in Dallas, Texas, Moses S. Belton, Council president, announced this week. The three days of meetings scheduled February 5-7, will be held in the Statler Hilton Hotel.

Dr. Hollis Price, president of LeMoyne College, Memphis, Tennessee, will address the opening conference session on Friday, February 5. He will deliver the keynote address on the conference theme: "The Impact of the United Negro College Fund in a Changing Society."

Workshops for students and alumni of colleges and universities affiliated with the Fund have been planned around the conference theme. Mrs. Claytie O. Searcy of Dallas reported. Mrs. Searcy is a faculty member of Bishop College and president of Collins, chairman of the board of Fidelity Union Life Insurance Company will be guest speaker at a dance and banquet on Saturday evening, February 6. Collins is also on the board of trustees of Bishop College in Dallas, one of the 33 colleges benefiting from Fund campaigns.

The Saturday evening banquet will be climaxed with the crowning of "Miss National UNCF." This event marks the culmination of the fund-raising efforts of UNCF students during the preceding year, according to Council president Belton.

"Each college selects a 'Miss UNCF' to represent her fellow students at the annual conference," Belton said. "The young lady to whom the national honor goes will be the representative of the college reporting the highest per capita student-giving ratio to the UNCF appeal."

The Mayor of the City of Dallas, Hon. Erik C. Jonsson, will extend the conference welcome.

Expected to attend the 1965 conference are UNCF alumni volunteer workers from 150 campaign centers across the country, elected officers of national alumni associations, UNCF member college alumni secretaries, UNCF campus campaign student leaders and Miss National UNCF contestants.

### North Carolina Garden Time

Whenever I want to convince myself that it is possible for every family, with a suitable location, to have a good vegetable garden I drive out US 1 by-pass South of Raleigh. I cut off at (Jones) Franklin Road and then on toward Faquay-Varina and Holly Springs. Along this route I have seen some real good ones.

Of first importance is the selection of the site. Avoid low, flat locations where drainage is likely to be poor and frost a hazard. For convenience, the garden should be located as near the house as possible. However, you may wish to sacrifice here for better soil elsewhere. This is especially true on the farm.

Water for irrigation is a must if you are to have tender and tasty vegetables during hot, dry weather. The water may come from a pond or stream if you have an irrigation system.

Practically all of our common vegetable crops thrive best in full sun. Since this is true, trees should be avoided for two reasons. In the first place they shade the plants; and secondly, they have extensive root systems which will rob the plants of moisture and nutrients.

The soil should be the best you have available. Don't expect much from fill soil until you have had a chance to build up the organic content and correct the pH and nutrient balance.

Ideally, you should have a top layer of soil two or three inches deep and well supplied with organic matter. The next three or four inches of soil should be rich and friable in order to serve as a moisture reserve. The bottom four or five inches should serve the purpose of good drainage.

### Discussion Held On Korean and W. W. II GI Ins.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—The re-opening of GI life insurance for about three million World War II and Korean Conflict veterans was the topic of discussion in Washington, D. C., recently when Norman Houston, board chairman of the Golden State Mutual Life Insurance Company, of California, visited Leon Wallace, director of VA's Insurance Service.

VA's Insurance Service is the third largest life insurance organization in the nation, having six million policies representing an in-force amount of insurance of \$5.9 billion.

Eligible veterans are those with service-connected disabilities with no insurable non-service disabilities or those whose disabilities are not service connected but are insurable by commercial companies at the highest rates.

All these will be entitled to re-instate the amount of GI insurance they either neglected to take out or allowed to lapse up to a total of \$10,000.
