

Dental Experts Urge Parents To Help Children Brush Their Teeth

Many an approving parent, charmed by a small child's engaging efforts to brush his teeth, has been inadvertently responsible for neglect that can lead to early tooth decay. Therefore, on the occasion of Children's Dental Health Week, February 7th thru 13th, it seems appropriate to point out to parents the proper way to care for young children's teeth.

Recent studies conducted by dentists reveal that youngsters have been entrusted with the task of brushing their teeth. The parents should perform this function at home so the child is entirely capable of doing it for himself.

In brushing the child's teeth, the parent should hold the child's head back with the left and under his chin. Then, with the right hand, systematically brush all the upper front teeth down at least four times; all the lower front teeth up at least four times. Then, go back to the molars on each side. A horizontal stroke should be used on chewing surfaces.

A new toothbrush, designed by dentists, makes it easy to follow the preferred method of brushing—up and down. Arrows on the handle of the toothbrush give these directional signals for better toothbrushing. The toothbrush comes in a special children's size.

(as well as adult) and the bristles are tooth-shaped to actually fit the profiles and contours of the teeth, when held in the proper brushing position. Long, green bristles clean in between the teeth; short, white bristles polish tooth surfaces.

The Accounting Technician and Accounting Clerk with starting salaries of \$4,400 and \$3,000 are for employment with the Federal Housing Administration and other Federal agencies in the Washington area. To qualify applicants must pass a written test and have appropriate experience or education. See Announcement No. 352-B for details. Applications must be filed with the Board of Examiners, Federal Housing Administration, Washington, D. C. 20411.

The Farmer jobs are at Federal correctional institutions and involve field crop, truck, swine, dairy, and beef cattle farming. The duties involve the supervision and training of inmates in these fields of work. Appropriate training and experience are required. Entrance salaries range from \$2.85 to \$4.09 an hour.
