# Kittrell Prexy To Deliver Hl Finals Address

KITRELL—Dr. Philip R. Cousin, President of Kittrell College, will deliver the principal address at the Henderson Institute's 69th annual commencement exercises June 4 in the Eaton-Johnson Auditorium, Henderson, at 3:30 p.m. to 171 students, the largest in the history of the school.

Dr. Cousin will bring with him a wealth of education which began at what is now known as Roosevelt High School in West Palm Beach, Florida. From Florida he went to Ohio where he received the Bachelor of Arts degree in Philosophy from Central State College in Wilberforce. He later matriculated to the Boston University School of Theology and obtained the degree of Bachelor of Sacred Theology. Not thoroughly contented, he has also done further study in education at Boston University.

An ordained minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Church, Dr. Cousin pastored in Florida, Danville and Norfolk Virginia prior to his election as president of Kittrell College an AME church supported school.

A North Carolina College graduate student will set sail on the SS Constitution July 7 for India where she will conduct a research project on the socio-cultural aspects of medical care and treatment in the province of Varanasi. The student, Vernaline Watson, was selected for a scholarship under the Fulbright-Hays Act, the basic purpose of which is to increase mutual understanding between people of the United States and the peoples of other countries through educational and cultural exchange. After orientation in Bombay, Miss Watson, who is working on a master's degree in sociology at NCC, will proceed to the school of Kashi Vrdyapith where she will spend one academic year. Miss Watson was graduated from Brawley High School, Scotland Neck, where she was an honor student, and received a B. A. degree cum laude from NCC in 1964.
