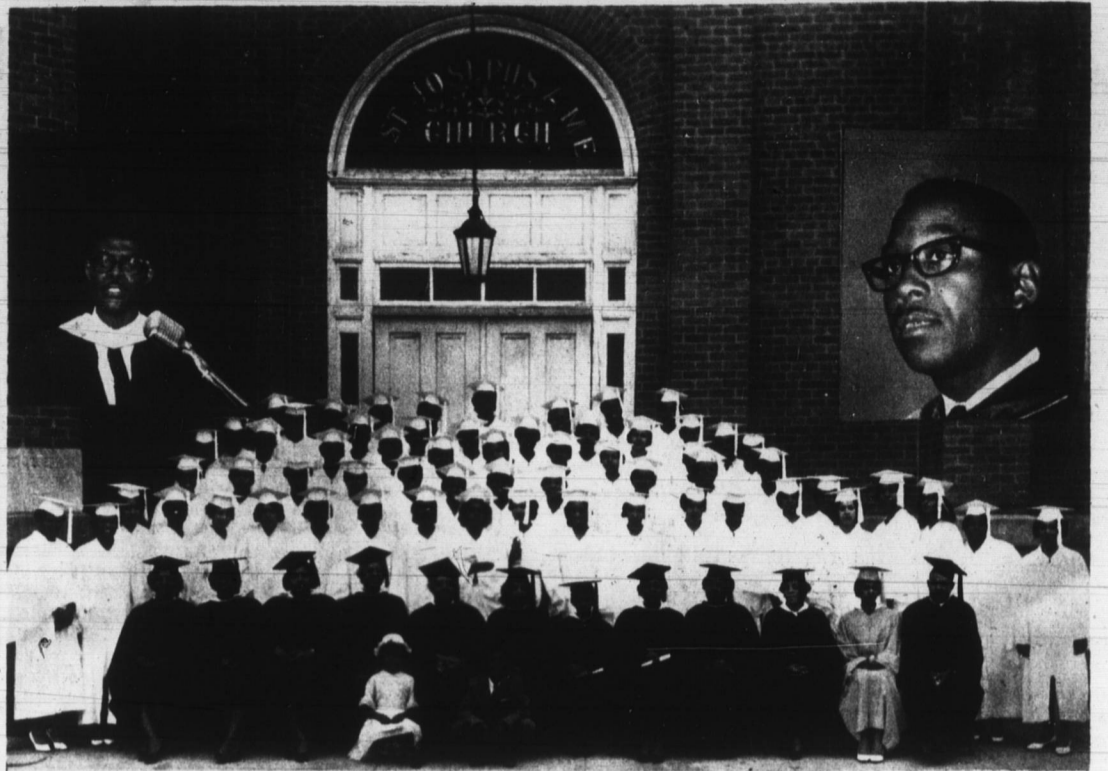

In addition to serving as College Minister, Rev. Alexander also teaches in the Department of Philosophy and Religion at Shaw University.

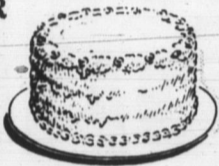
