Vandellas In TV Debut on Sullivan Show

NEW YORK — Detroit's Martha and the Vandellas debuted recently on Ed Sullivan's CBS-TV Show. The trio-lead singer Martha Reeves, Rosiland Ashford and Betty Kelly — won a "Grammy" Award in 1963 for their disk "Heat Wave."

They became the third Motown Recording Artists to appear on the "you've got it made" Sullivan Show. Their predecessors were Stevie Wonder and the Supremes...

BRENDA Holloway, another Motown artist will appear in the pilot film of a new half-hour television series being created by Four Star Television Productions in cooperation with Teen-Age Fair, Incorporated. Brenda recently concluded an engagement at "It's Boss" on Hollywood's Sunset Strip. Phillips Records has the trumpets out heralding the arrival of another one of those British import groups. This one, called "The End" — meaning they're supposed

to be the living end — is made up of five youngsters who come from Surrey's Guildford district and who are the first management clients of Bill Wyman of the Rolling Stones.

THE GROUP'S first recording bid "I Can't Cry No Joy," backed by "Little Girl" is out on Philips. Colin Griffith plays guitar, tenor sax and sings. Dave Brown works

out on bass and vocals. There are drummer Roger Graham and baritone sax John Horton. They are all in their early twenties. With Wyman piloting them, you can expect to hear a great deal about them. Add to the roster of new groups — Mercury Records A and R producers Dennis Lambert and Lou Courtney are excited about a discov-

ery of theirs called the Sapians. From Newburgh, New York, the kids were once thrown out of school for refusing to get proper haircuts. In spite of this, the Mercury execs believe they have great promise. We'll see.

Girl Accuses Jim Brown

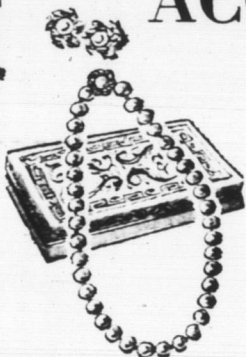
