Operation Breakthrough Hires Additional Help

Operation Breakthrough's program for the poor will be strengthened considerably by the hiring of a staff member and ten aides in its Target Area B (Edgemont, East End, Few Gardens), according to John Brew, acting coordinator of that target area.

Mrs. Palis Jeffreys of 610 N. Roxboro St. has been appointed to the full-time position of coordinator of child develop-

ment programs in the area. "Mrs. Jeffreys has been an outstanding leader in her community," Brew stated. "For the past several years she has spent her own time and money counseling and working with underprivileged teen-age girls," he continued.

Hired to assist regular staff members on a part-time basis were ten aides, all from Target Area B. They will work as

"sub-professionals" and, following a period of training, will help to increase the scope of programs in home management, health-welfare, tutorials, and visitation.

Mrs. Thora McElroy, home management coordinator, will be aided by Mrs. Merrita Lockamy of 5-B Few Gardens, Mrs. Iris Cates of 919 Elizabeth St., Mrs. Lillie Bullock of 404 Canal St., and Mrs. Mary Canady of 312 Dowd St. Working as health-welfare aides will be Mrs. Myrtle Milan of 204 Lyon St., Mrs. Lottie Holloway of 306 Wake Place, and Mrs. Margaret Thornton of 808 Glendale Ave.

Brew further announced that Mrs. Carolyn Johnson of 917 Elizabeth St. and Mrs. Bernice Riley of 918 Elizabeth St. have been employed as tutorial center aides.

The "Friendly Visitors" program, wherein elderly people who live alone are visited by volunteers, will be bolstered by the services of Mrs. C. L. Smith of 908 Gurley St.
