The responses receiv fem ordof8--m mtm mara ceived from the presidents of these colleges and the individual reports of Task Force members were so overwhelmingly favorable that the Vice Presi dent requested that this program not only be continued but expanded to include minority high schools.

The high school phase was launched last October in Cleveland, with 20 Task Force members participating in three motivation programs before 21,000 students in 13 junior and senior high schools.

Based on a survey of 9,100 of the students who participated in the pilot project, the Cleveland Public School System has strongly recommended similar programs in school systems in other cities where there is a substanial enrollment of minority students.
