BENNETT COLLEGE COED TO ATTEND SUMMER INSTITUTE

GREENSBORO—Miss Jacqueline Parham, of Washington, N. C. rising senior at Bennett College, has been notified that she is one of 30 students who have been awarded Association of American Geographers fellowships to attend a summer institute in geography at Clark University, Worcester, Mass., June 13-August 5.
 The institute is co-sponsored by the association and Clark and is supported by the National Science Foundation. All expenses are paid, in addition to a travel allowance and a stipend of \$60 a week. Miss Parham, valedictorian of her high school class, plans to teach geography in the elementary schools.

NEW ORLEANS, La.—Twenty-one specially selected managers of life insurance district offices were scheduled to begin a two-week, intensive study course in management at Dillard University, here starting June 6.

The course conducted by the National Insurance Association is designed to present field managements of member companies with proven know how in recruiting and managing sales staffs, administration and public relations.

Calvin Vismale, a Chartered Life Underwriter and assistant agency officer of Supreme Life Insurance Company of America, Chicago, is dean of the NIA 10th Institute in Agency Management. Octave Lilly, of New Orleans, agency officer for Peoples Life Insurance Company of Louisiana, associate dean, and Edward Robinson of Philadelphia, vice president of Provident Home Industrial Mutual Life Insurance Company will share in the instructions.

J. A. Blaine Dejoie, of New Orleans, secretary of Peoples Life and the National Insurance Association, and Charles A. Davis of Chicago, NIA executive director, were scheduled to take part in the opening and orientation sessions of the Institute.
 Companies sending students to the sessions at Dillard University include Great Lakes Mutual Life in Detroit; Pilgrim Health and Life, Augusta, Ga.; Universal Life, Memphis; Supreme Life, Chicago; North Carolina Mutual, Durham; Peoples Life, New Orleans; Standard Life, New Orleans, and Mammoth Life, Louisville.
 Veterans who served after January 31, 1955 are now eligible for care and treatment in VA Hospitals on the same basis as wartime veterans, according to the Veterans Administration.

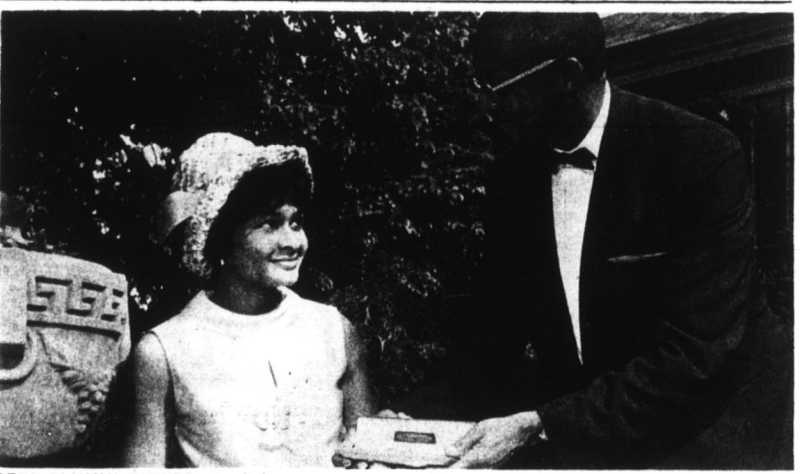
Feted by Mrs. Dan K. Moore
