

Dr. Darwin T. Turner Named Dean of A&T Grad School

GREENSBORO—A professor at A. and T. College, who returned last week after a one-year leave, has been named dean of the Graduate School.

Dr. Darwin T. Turner, former professor and chairman of the Department of English, assumed the position on June 1. He replaces J. Niel Armstrong who has served as acting graduate dean since last September, and as director of the Summer School.

Dr. Walter C. Daniel, who during the absence of Dr. Turner has served as acting chairman of the Department of English, will become chairman. Armstrong will continue as director of the Summer School. Announcement of the shifts was made over the weekend by Dr. Lewis C. Dowdy, president of the college.

Turner was a fellow in the Duke University-University of North Carolina Cooperative Program in the Humanities, conducting a study of a group of Negro writers of the 19th and 20th centuries.

Cited as a scholar in English many times, Dr. Turner was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa at the age of 15, received the A.B. degree at 16 and the M.A. degree at 18, both from the University of Cincinnati, and while he was also teaching in Florida, received the Ph.D. degree from the University of Chicago at the age of 24.

AMERICAN JEWISH CONGRESS OPPOSE MEMORIALIZING RANKIN

NEW YORK—The American Jewish Congress today (Monday) called on the House of Representatives to reject a proposal to name a veteran's hospital for the late Representative John E. Rankin of Mississippi.

Howard M. Squadron of New York, a vice president of the national Jewish body and chairman of its Commission on Law and Social Action, termed the former Mississippi Congressman "one of the most vicious apostles of hatred ever to hold public office." He declared: "It would be shocking if a government facility open to veterans of all races and religions were to be named for a

man whose hatred for Jews and Negroes was so intense and so notorious as to have become a veritable fetish."

Squadron made the Congress views known in a letter to House Speaker John W. McCormack. Noting that the House Veterans Affairs Committee had approved bill authorizing naming the veteran's hospital for Rankin, the American Jewish Congress leader said that if the bill passed, "someone at the Veterans' Administration will have the painful duty of deciding which of Rankin's remarks should be carved into the stones of the new hospital."
