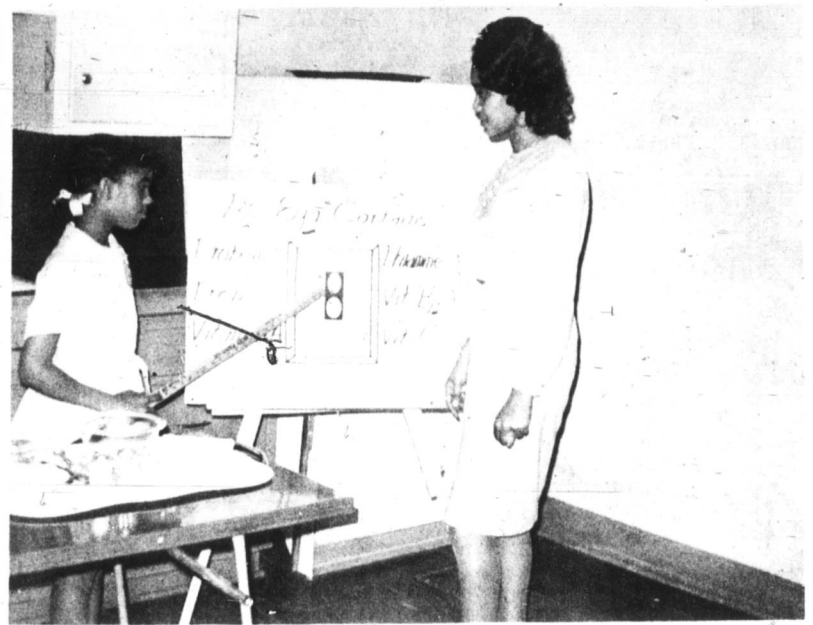
He spoke on the subject: "Man's Responsibilities to the Community and Church."

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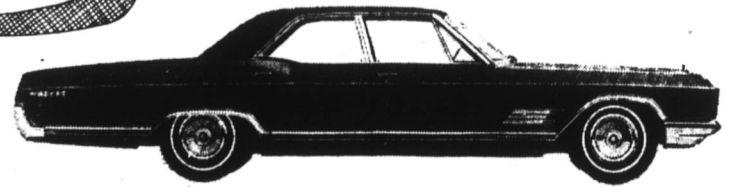
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
