is the most dwarfing type, the trees reaching a height of from 6 to 10 feet at maturity. They bear early, sometimes at the end of the second growing season, if

well attended. They should be planted in good soil and staked for support until they are well established in the soil. They may also be supported by a wire trellis, a wall or lattice support-Espalier training. These varieties are satisfactory: Yellow Transparent. Golden, Delicious and Richard Delicious (or Winesap or Stayman Winesap).

It is important to remember that I am giving fruitful combinations and varieties which I know are available on Malling 9 rootstock. Both Winesap and Stayman are self- and cross-unfruitful so Golden Delicious is necessary as a source of viable and compatible pollen to fertilize the blossoms of Winesap and Stayman . At EXPO 67—New York Execs Jet in Style to Canada's Big Expo '67

MONTREAL (CFN)-A group of executives from New York recently flew into Montreal, Canada as guests of the Canadian Government, the Advertising and Sales Executives Club of Montreal and the officials of Expo '67—the big world's fair due to open next spring.

Expo '67 is still in the con-struction stage but the sprawling site will be ready for visitors from around the world by April, 1967. The members of the New York Sales Executives Club were in-vited to tour the exposition in order to see the vast enterprise before it reached the final stages of completion.
