This is a big year for our neighbor to the North, Canada. It's the 100th anniversary of the founding of Canada as a nation — and highlighting the event is Expo '67, the world's fair at Montreal.

In honor of the occasion, the Canadian government has issued a newly designed set of coins for all denominations from one cent through the silver dollar. The one dollar bill has also been redesigned.

It marks the first time Canada has issued new designs for each denomination of coinage to commemorate an event, points out Ken Bressett, numismatic editor at Whitman Publishing Company, Racine, Wis.

The coins depict wild life native to Canada, ranging from the mackerel to the Canadian goose.

You can obtain uncirculated sets of the new coins (limit — 5 sets per person) by writing to: Coins Uncirculated, Post Office Box 470, Ottawa 2, Ontario, Canada.

Your order should be accompanied by a certified check or money order made out to the Receiver General of Canada. Each set costs \$4.00.

One of the main reasons for increasing popularity of Canadian coin collecting here is the similarity between U.S. coinage and that of Canada. With the exception of a few rare issues, Canadian coins are readily available from American numismatic dealers at reasonable prices.

All Canadian monies are listed, priced and described in Whitman's 1967 Standard Catalogue of Canadian Coins, Tokens and Paper Money, by J. E. Charlton. This volume is regarded as the most authoritative reference on current retail values of Canadian coins.
