

The one dollar bill bit also have reduced has also been redesigned. It marks the first time Canat has issued new designs for each denomination of coinage to commemorate an event, points out Ken Bressett, nu-mismatic editor at Whitman Publishing Company, Racine, Wie Wis. The coins depict wild life native to Canada, ranging from the mackerel to the Canadian goose.
