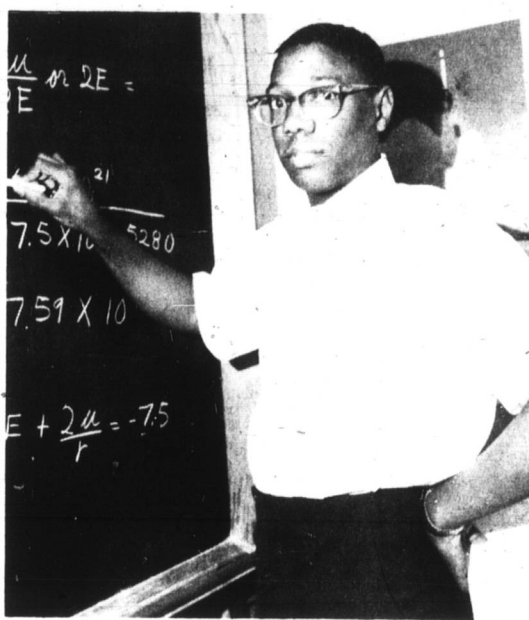

### Virginia Union University Sets Finals Rites

RICHMOND, Va. — Virginia Union University will hold its Sixty-Seventh Commencement activities June 3 through June 5. Some 5,000 alumni, parents of graduating seniors and friends will visit the campus for the rites. Approximately 220 seniors are expected to graduate. However, the final list will not be released until the middle of the week. The breakdown follows: 72 for the B.S. degree, 140 for the B.A. degree and 8 for the B.D. degree. This will be one of the largest graduating classes in fifteen years.

The Baccalaureate Service will be held in Barco-Stevens Hall Sunday, June 4 at 4:00 p.m. (E.D.T.). Dr. John M. Ellison, Chancellor of the University will preach. Dr. Ellison is a native of Northumberland County, Virginia where he received his early education. He matriculated in the Normal and Industrial Institute (now Virginia State College) and earned the B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from Virginia Union University (1917), Oberlin Graduate School of Theology in Ohio (1927), and Drew University in New Jersey (1933), respectively.

Following the Baccalaureate service, President and Mrs. Henderson will hold a reception at their home for parents, faculty and friends.

Camp In-Ch-Co is planned to provide a camping experience in the country where boys and girls can play and work together in a wholesome atmosphere under the guidance of well qualified and experienced leaders. Here they will be helped to develop principles of honesty, sportsmanship, thoughtfulness, and courtesy. Camp activities will include sports of all kinds, team games, treasure hunts, musical activities, folk and square dancing, nature hikes, swimming, trips to places of particular interest, dramatics and handcrafts.

TRUE EVANGELISM

In St. Paul's mighty *Epistle to the Romans* he declares "the gospel of good news" of God concerning His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord" (Rom. 1:1-3). The good news which Paul proclaimed was essentially about Christ. He was always talking about Christ. His epistle was filled with Christ. In his message Christ was everything. This is in striking contrast to much of modern evangelism, which is not Christ-centered, but man-centered. Dr. A. W. Tozer, shortly before his death, wrote: "The flaw in current evangelism lies in its humanistic approach. It is frankly fascinated by the great, noisy, aggressive world with its big names, its hero worship, its wealth and paganism. This gross misapprehension of the truth is lack of much of our present evangelistic activity. This concept of Christianity is a radical error and because it touches the souls of men it is a dangerous, even deadly, error. It is little more than a weak humanism allied with weak Christianity to give it ecclesiastical respectability. Invariably it begins with man and his needs and then looks around for God while true Christianity reveals God as searching for man to show him that God is here and that His power and love in defeating Satan, overcoming death, nailing the law to His cross and paying for man the just penalty for sin, so that all who believe might be justified. This is why Paul's gospel is called in Scripture "the gospel [good news] of the grace of God" (Acts 20:24) and "the gospel of the glory of Christ" (II Cor. 4:4). To enter experientially into the truth of this good news is the greatest blessing one can possibly enjoy. It will give the believer the absolute assurance of salvation and cause him, like Paul, to *boast in the Cross of Christ* (Gal. 6:14), in what He has accomplished there and in what He is wanting to do in the life of any sinner who will trust Him.
