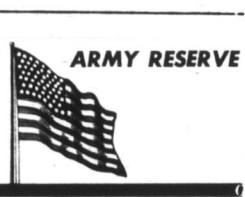

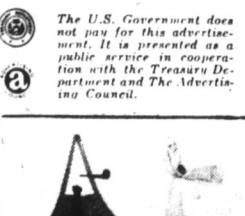

### Sew Happy with DONNA DRITZ

Here's a neat conversation piece to start your barbecue rolling — matching "his" and "hers" aprons.  
 A cinch to make, all you'll need for "his" are: Simplicity Pattern No. 3206, 1 1/4 yards plain 36" cotton material and Dritz Ball Point Bodkin for apron ties.  
 "Hers" calls for a 36" square of fabric cut on grain and a Dritz apron clip. For your pockets, simply fold up the bottom edge 8" and press. Fold up another 8" and press again. Now mark the pockets 12" from each side and stitch. As a channel for your apron clip, fold over a 1" hem at the top.
