## 3 AMEZ Ministers to Receive Honorary Degrees at Livingstone

SALLISBURY — Three ministers of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, one of them a Livingstone graduate, are scheduled to receive Doctor of Divinity honorary degree at the 87th Commencement scheduled at Livingstone College on Tuesday, May 27; it has been announced by Dr. F. George Shipmen, president of the college.

They are: Rev. Andrew Wesley Mapp, Jersey City, N.J.; Rev. Samuel Hart Williams, Brooklyn, N. Y.; and Rev. Carroll McCoy Felton Jr., Chicago, Ill.

All three are outstanding leaders of the AME Zion Church which sponsors the church-related college.

Rev. Mr. Mapp is a 1950 graduate of Livingstone and received the B.D. degree from Hood Theological Seminary in 1953. He has done graduate work at Cornell University.

Rev. Mr. Mapp belongs to the NAACP, the Central Budget Board of the AME Zion Church, the Commission on Organic Union of the AME Zion Church, the Ministers' Alliance of Jersey City and the North Jersey AME Zion Ministers' alliance.

Rev. Mr. Williams, who has been presiding elder of the Brooklyn District of the AME Zion Church since 1957, graduated from college in Jamaica, West Indies in 1908 and received the B.D. degree from Howard University Seminary in 1920 and the MST degree from Union Theological Seminary of Columbia University in 1936.

Rev. Mr. Felton, who is pastor of Blackwell Memorial AME Zion Church of Chicago, received the BA degree from Knoxville College in 1960 and the BD degree from Gammon Theological Seminary in 1961. He was a Fod Fellow at the Urban Training Center in Chicago.

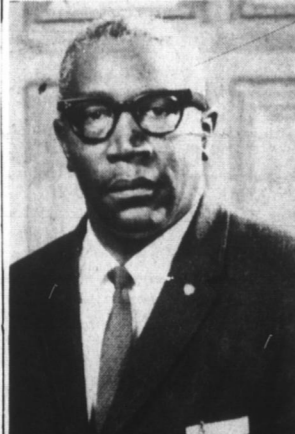
