Since the purpose is to save,

make the bank yourself using papier mache mixture. What you will need, you probably already have at home: a bal-

loon, cardboard tube, egg carton, tape, newspaper, tissue or paper bags, a bowl and in stant laundry starch. Gather all materials together on a

protected work surface.

Begin by making a frame.

This will be covered with pa-

per dipped in a starch papier

mache mixture that hardens when dry for a rigid shape. Blow up the balloon for body shape. Cut the cardboard tube

into 4 equal leg size shapes.

Tape legs to balloon. Tape one section from an egg carton to one end of the balloon for

a snout. Tear paper into strips

Then prepare papier mache mixture. Mix equal parts of Niagara instant laundry starch

and cool water (about 1 cup

of each) in a bowl. Let stand

and wrap around frame. All

Now all it needs is a few coins to make the bank complete.

Although the pig seems to be the traditional shape for banks, tradition need not be followed. This starch mixture could be used for an elephant bank or maybe even a striped tiger bank. When you make it yourself, you can create just what you want.
